And he said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. It was fitting to celebrate and be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive; he was lost, and is found.' - Luke 15: 31-32 **ESV**

The stories in Luke Chapter 15 about lost things- sheep, coin, and son reveal the heart (the sacrifice, efforts and joy) of the owner (Our father God) share in finding the lost.

In the story of the lost or "prodigal son," we encounter the heart of the father who goes 'far beyond' to restore the lost. The notorious younger son is always considered really "lost" because he physically lost his **access** to the father for the **assets** from the father. Rather pathetically, the "loyal" elder son who was physically present with the father was spiritually lost to the father: to the heart and joys of the father.

Many Christians' default sympathy is with the one who went far away into physical sins. However, most of us inadvertently, are like the elder son who legalistically pursues the father's work/service and miss the heart of the father, and lose out on the joys that should be theirs in Christian service.

Such Christians, deep within them, do not share the joy of a terrible sinner who repents. There is a sense of "he/she has lived out all the sinful pleasure that the others could not and yet they are accepted by God on equal status." This explains why we destroy brothers and sisters who have fallen in one sin and in the spirit of Christ, I ask, "What has happened to restoration of the weak brother, (Gal. 6:2)?"

The line between these two is thin. However, it's important to remember that God, our Father is ever happy to restore any repentant lost, "away or at home," Alleluia!

Micah Ayuba, is my name and I am presently studying in Abuja Bible College (ABC) in Kagoro. Abuja Bible College (ABC) in Kagoro Nigeria has been for me a process of un-learning and re-learning. My study in the above mentioned institution has impacted positively my Bible interpretation ability. It has exposed me to the principles of expository preaching, widened my spectrum of understanding of the different genre of the books of the Bible. I have come to learn that context drives meaning in terms of interpretation and preaching from a particular passage of the Bible.

I learned that the Bible is a Christo-Centric Book, such that Christ gives it the cohesion from Genesis to Revelation. Therefore, when preaching from any passage of the Bible the teacher should "wear the glass" of Christ for its exposition. I also commend the effectiveness and commitment with which our teachers are handling the program. I recommend this training to Pastors, Church elders and leaders. Also Sunday school teachers and Bible study facilitators in Churches should enrol into this program, because it will give them a deeper understanding of how to handle and teach the Bible.
